email from Pat with SAPIC regarding what they "expect" of a meeting: Usually the business meetings begin at 10:00 AM on the second Saturday of April, July and October. Typically, about 35-40 SAPIC members attend. Since they come from many areas of the state, most of the hosts provide coffee, juice and a snack (doughnuts, pastries, cookies or whatever you wish) prior to the meeting — available about 9:00-9:15 AM. A meeting place that will accommodate about 40 persons is needed. The president tries to limit the meeting to about 1 hour - 1 1/2 hours. The host group sometimes likes to have a short presentation about their cemetery projects/events or places of interest in their area. If you wish, you can provide lunch at the meeting place. This can be a fundraiser for your cemetery group. Some groups like to have the presentation during lunch. Since many members will have a distance to return home, many will want to leave soon after lunch. Providing lunch is optional — you can, instead, provide information about eating establishments in the area or reserve a room at a restaurant so members can have lunch "on their own." In case, members wish to come the night before it is helpful to provide overnight accommodations. We will also need to have directions to the meeting site and at least one contact person, in case members have further questions.

Our next meeting and work day will be held at the Young Cemetery on April 2nd at 1pm.

Carleton has been talking with Ed Christopher about the ST Bridget's Cemetery. We would like to get out there before grass, etc gets too big. Carleton will be in touch.
